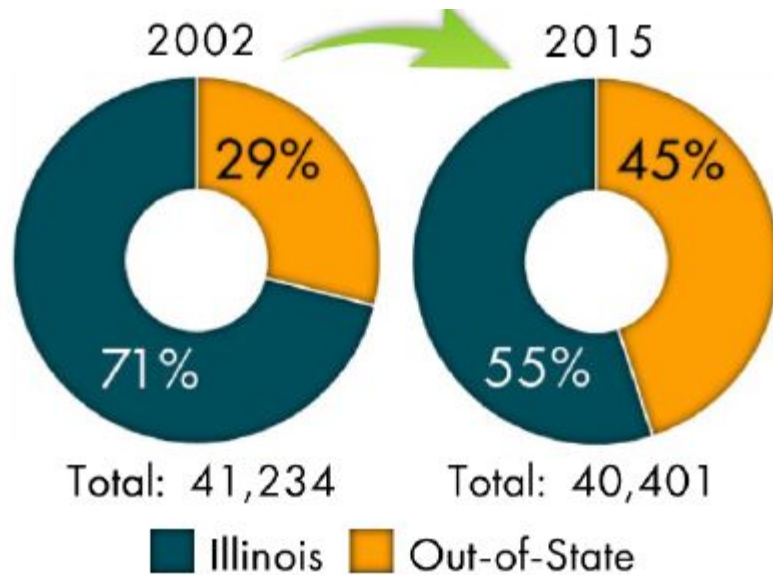
Dear Colleagues,

Welcome back! I hope you enjoyed your holiday break as much as I did and are returning to work ready to start another exciting semester. At the beginning of this new calendar year, I would like to seek your support for two initiatives in our College:

1. **Student Success Initiative (SSI):** After the 2016 fall semester final examination, CASA had 18 students on academic suspension and 65 students on academic probation. The SSI is a collective effort to help our students with the following goals: (1) Continue our “NEAT” initiative to monitor student academic success; (2) Focusing on students with a GPA around 1.85 to 2.35; (3) Providing mid-term grades to students for major courses as well as 100- and 200-level courses by the end of the 8th week; and (4) Providing additional advisement to “at-risk” students.
2. **Community College Connection Initiative (C3I):** This initiative aims at building a pipeline for post-secondary education through a systematic outreach and collaboration with high school districts and community colleges. Taking accessibility and affordability into consideration, the C3I initiative offers a pathway for high school students and two-year college students to earn a baccalaureate or graduate degree. C3I consists of three components: (1) Offering cutting-edge technological courses in high schools and community colleges through online courses; (2) Organizing events and student competitions to enhance connections; and (3) Providing workshops and seminars to high school and community college teachers.

On March 1st, members of the SIU community will join together for an extraordinary day of giving back. The goal is simple: to inspire Salukis everywhere to come together, demonstrate their pride for SIU, and provide essential funding to support SIU students and help shape the University. You will receive more information when we get closer to the SIU Day of Giving. This is a timely fundraising effort, and together we can open the door to opportunity at CASA.

As many of you know, there is little progress in terms of the state budget impasse up to this point. The Illinois General Assembly is back in session now, and I hope we could hear some positive news of the state budget soon. Due to the state budget impasse, our University has not received state appropriation for the past 19 months except a “stopgap” funding in April of 2016. A report from IBHE, as shown in the picture below, indicates that the enrollment of Illinois residents at Illinois colleges is at a recent low, while enrollment of Illinois residents at out-of-state institutions is at an all-time high (2014). Illinois (-16,623) currently ranks second to New Jersey (-29,101) in terms of net loss due to migration. Eliminating the net loss would result in more than \$215 million in additional tuition and fees revenue to Illinois colleges and universities (using the average tuition and fees for Illinois public universities, but not including the increased revenues to communities from other normal student expenditures for room, board and living expenses).

2017 SUMMER RESEARCH SUPPORT

In order to promote research and creativity, further develop our College's unique strengths and opportunities in applied and interdisciplinary research, and grow CASA's extramural research funding, the College will continue to support faculty summer research in 2017. Please note two important changes in this year's guidelines:

1. The summer research support is open to all faculty, **including NTT faculty**. The preference will be given to junior faculty.
2. The top criterion to win this support is the "potential to generate results **to secure external funding**." In other words, we hope to provide a seed fund for those projects to be able to seek extramural funding.

Please prepare your proposal early and submit it before March 15, 2017. Again, we will use a "double blind" peer review process. Mary will remove the author identity before sending the proposal to the Research Committee to review. For more information, please check the College webpage:

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY AWARD NOMINATION

The most prestigious award in CASA, the E.J. and Mary C. Simon Distinguished Faculty Award, is calling for nominations. Ernest J. Simon was dean of the College from its inception in 1951 until his retirement in 1970, and both he and his wife, Mary C. Simon, remained strong supporters of the University and CASA. This award recognizes the overall accomplishments of a faculty member in support of his or her respective program and can only be received once in a lifetime. This award is intended to acknowledge, celebrate, and reward extraordinary lifetime achievement with respect to teaching and other activities directly related to the education and general welfare of students of the College of Applied Sciences and Arts. This is the top faculty award in our College. The recipient receives \$5,000 and a plaque, and makes a speech at the annual *CASA Honors Day* Ceremony.

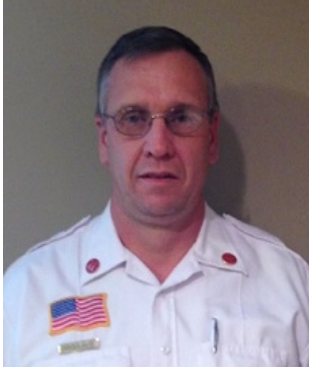
